We are passionate about providing an excellent outdoor adventure programme run by instructors who uphold our ethos and values. We have made this happen through our Instructor Training Programme (ITP). Since 2011, this programme has helped over 130 young people gain qualifications in outdoor adventure activities. The course offers a good mix of faith, learning and adventure over one or two years.

How has this experience changed you?

Before joining I thought I was a fairly confident guy, but over the last year I've come out of my shell when I didn't even realise I had a shell! I have become more confident in working with children and young people, public speaking and in my walk with God.

What was the best part?

I thoroughly enjoyed the amount of **amazing new opportunities** we've been given. We've learnt so many new outdoor activities from archery to kayaking. If I had to choose one, it would be learning to abseil.

What are you planning to do when you finish the programme?

I am going to university to study primary education to be a teacher. Something that I feel working at Rock UK has greatly equipped me to do. After two years of teaching in the outdoors, I hope I can bring that same enthusiasm, energy and excitement to the classroom.

It's not only the physical training that we focused on but the spiritual training as well. **We all witnessed God move amongst each other and within ourselves.**

THE PROVISION OF EXCELLENT FACILITIES

SUMMIT CENTRE

After years of planning, praying and preparing for the redevelopment of our centre in South Wales, in May 2018 we finally **welcomed our first residential group** from Priory Church Primary School, Brecon.

Since that first residential visit in 2018 we have enjoyed welcoming hundreds of guests through the doors of Summit Centre, including HRH The Prince of Wales!



At Summit Centre we can now offer ensuite accommodation for 104 guests, bedrooms equipped to support visitors with disabilities, a large dining room, meeting rooms, café and a fun outdoor children's play area to complement our existing climbing centre.

We are delighted to have the support of **Welsh Government**, who **invested £2.3m** into Summit Centre's development through the EU funded Tourism Attractor Destination programme, as well as financial support from the Ffos y Fran Community Fund, the Big Lottery Fund People and Places Programme and various Trusts and individuals from across the private sector.

We are thankful to our funders who, through their generosity, enabled the redevelopment of this site into a smart, first class climbing and activity centre. Every day we see young people overcome fears and learn new skills.

FRONTIER CENTRE

WHITHAUGH PARK

We continue to improve and make plans to develop Whithaugh Park, our residential centre situated in the unspoilt landscape of the Scottish Borders countryside.

In the future we have planning permission to build 15 new fully ensuite guest lodges, four new communal day lodges and two new staff lodges on our scenic site! This ambitious vision will develop a centre to meet the needs of the next generation. We seek God's provision for the funds to complete this project which is expected to cost around £6.5m. We are very excited about the plans and cannot wait to get started on it all!

In the meantime, it is business as usual for our team at Whithaugh Park as they seek to bring life-changing outdoor adventure to young people visiting the centre.

Just recently we were thrilled to receive a grant towards the replacement of our Sports Hall floor, from the National Lottery Community Fund. We are keen to provide excellent facilities for our visitors and for those living in the local community. This new floor will be a blessing to our local youth, who will now have a safe, warm and dry place to meet and play team games during the darker, colder and wetter months of the year.
